Motions are due asking the court to exclude or limit certain evidence at trial. Each side has until January 5 to oppose one another's motions, and then until January 21 to reply to the opposition. The judge will rule prior to trial on January 31



Expert witness disclosure

JANUARY



Both sides must disclose what expert witnesses they intend to have testify at trial, including written reports of the opinions and facts they will express and exhibits they intend to offer

By this date, lawyers for both sides must file their opposition to opposing counsel's motion to exclude evidence

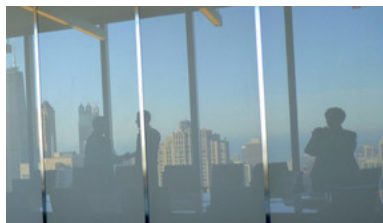


Objections against excluding evidence

Judges at this final meeting between the parties often use this conference to encourage settling cases



Pre-trial conference

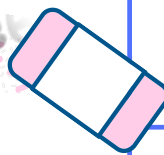

JANUARY

At the conference, the judge and the lawyers can review the evidence and clarify the issues in dispute. They may also try to agree on undisputed facts or points of law in order to shorten the trial's duration

By this date, attorneys must reply to opposing counsel's objections to excluding evidence. The judge can then rule any time before trial is scheduled to begin January 31

The trial begins at 9 a.m. PST with jury selection. It is expected to last between 10 and 15 court days. Judges hold trials only four days a week, meaning the trial could last almost a month
